**Junior, Foward - Thamesford, Ontario/ Bluewater Hawks**

In the opening weekend, assistant captain Jenna McCall led the team having tallied 4 goals and 3 assists for 7 total points. Against New England College she put up three points including the game winning goal and 2 assists. Against, Norwich she tallied her first hat trick of the season which included two power play goals.

### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK



**Jillian Bergeron** - Oswego State

Bergeron was named to the all-tournament team at the Rutland Herald Invitational hosted by Castleton State College after helping the Lakers (2-0-0) to their first tournament title in their three-year varisty history with a 2-0 win over SUNY Potsdam in the championship game. Bergeron was named the game's first star after tallying her first collegiate goal with the game's opening goal one minute into the second period.

### HONOR ROLL

**Samantha Rowan** - Utica College

**Senior, Foward - Trenton, Mich./ Belle Tire**

Rowan, a senior assistant captain, totaled a team high five points in two Pioneer victories. She tallied two assists in the Pioneers' 3-2 victory over visiting Norwich Univeristy. She then scored her 30th career goal while adding two assists in the Pioneers' 5-0 shutout victory over visiting New England College. She is tied with former USCHO.com All-American Jill Nolan on the Utica College all-time scoring list with 61 career points.

**Jill Doherty** - Utica College

Doherty posted her first shutout of the season in the Pioneers' 5-0 win over visiting New England College. The 5 foot 10 junior stopped all 20 shots she faced saturday and she now has five career shutouts. She is 14-6 in 20 career games played and her career goals against average is an impressive 1.44.

**Katie Double** - Cortland State

**Freshman, Goalie - Farmington, NY./Victor H.S.**

Double stopped 42 of 45 shots she faced in five periods versus Salve Regina in her first collegiate action. For the weekend, she posted a 1.80 GAA and a .933 save percentage.



### Buffalo State

Buffalo State had the weekend off and is now preparing to open ECAC West play when they welcome No. 2 Elmira to the Ice Arena for a pair of games this weekend. The Bengals will be seeking revenge after the Soaring Eagles eliminated Buffalo State from last year's playoffs with a 3-2 win in the quarterfinals. Buffalo State is also looking to score its first goal of the season after suffering a pair of shutout losses at Adrian to open the season.



### Chatham University

The Chatham Cougars opened their season at Lake Forest College and dropped the contest by a score of 5-0. Chatham beat Robert Morris by a 3-1 score. Chatham opens ECAC West play when they host Cortland State for two games on November 8 and 9.



### Cortland State

The Red Dragons opened their season with a pair of games at Salve Regina, falling 2-0 and 3-0. In Friday's game, sophomore goalie Briana Barlett made five saves in the opening period before freshman Kaite Double, who stopped all 16 shots she faced over the final two periods. Double returned Saturday and registered 26 saves. Cortland plays a pair of games at Chatham this weekend.



### Elmira College

The Soaring Eagles Women' Hockey team started off the 2008-09 regular season in dominant fashion capturing 8-0 victories over ECAC East opponents New England College and Norwich University. The victories were highlighted by dominant play from the team's upperclassmen and solid play by the newcomers. The Soaring Eagles hit the road to open up conference play against Buffalo State.

### Oswego State

Oswego State (2-0-0) opened the 2008-09 season with a pair of victories in capturing the Rutland Herald Invitational hosted by Castleton State College. The Lakers opened with a 4-1 victory over Saint Michael's and a 2-1 win over first-year program and ECAC West newcomer SUNY Potsdam in the championship game. The tournament triumph was the first in school history for the Lakers. The Lakers will meet Potsdam this weekend for the ECAC West opening series at Oswego.



### Plattsburgh State

Plattsburgh shut out Nepean Wildcats, 6-0, in a home exhibition game. Laurie Bowler (2g-2a) and Danielle Blanchard (1g-3a) led the way with four points apiece. Two-time defending NCAA champion Cardinals are the unanimous No. 1 pick in the NCAA Division III preseason coaches' poll compiled by USCHO.com, receiving all 15 first-place votes and 150 points.



### SUNY Potsdam

SUNY Potsdam earned their first win of the season as they defeated Castleton 4-2 in the inaugural game of the Rutland Herald Invitational. Potsdam lost a close decision in the SUNYAC rival championship game against Oswego 2-1.



### Rochester Institute of Tech.

RIT, ranked seventh in Division III, served notice that it will be one of the top teams in the nation after opening the year with a 2-1 win over Division I Robert Morris. It was RIT's first ever win against the Colonials. The Tigers host Neumann for a pair of games this weekend. RIT is 4-0-0 all-time against the Knights, including a pair of wins in Aston, Pa. last season.



### Utica College

Utica College went 2-0 this past weekend to open the 2008-09 season, marking the fourth time in program history that UC has began the regular season with two consecutive victories. Sophomore forward Meagan Sudik netted one goal and added three assists in the two Pioneers victories, while Andrea Maxon netted her 27th and 28th career goals over the two game span.
