**Junior, Forward - Thamesford, Ontario**

### Honor Roll

**Stephanie Moberg - Plattsburgh State**  
**Junior, Forward - Saratoga Springs, N.Y./Northwood School**

Moberg led the Cardinals with four goals during a 3-0 week, including a hat-trick in the first game of the Buffalo State series. Moberg also had 14 shots and a plus-3 rating. She was credited with two power play and game-winning goals each.

**Emi Williams - Oswego State**  
**Sophomore, Goalie - Anchorage, AK./Anchorage Northstars**

Williams registered back-to-back shutouts in leading the Lakers to a pair of 1-0 victories over SUNY Cortland in ECAC Women's West play on Jan. 30 and Feb. 1 in Oswego. Williams stopped all 16 Cortland shots in the Saturday win and made 15 saves in game two of the series. Williams, who improved to 6-5-0 on the season, has allowed only one goal in winning her last three starts.

**Amy Torgerson - Rochester Institute of Technology**  
**Freshman, Goalie - Wentzville, Mo./Gilmour Academy**

Torgerson moved to 5-0-0 this season after stopping 15 shots in a 2-1 win over Utica on Sunday. She has a 1.69 goals against average and .918 save percentage.



### Buffalo State

Buffalo State was outmatched against No. 2-ranked Plattsburgh this past weekend, falling 10-0 and 5-0 in a pair of league games at Stafford Arena. The road does not get much easier this weekend when the Bengals will host No. 3 Middlebury on Saturday and No. 6 Amherst on Sunday in a pair of non-conference games.



### Chatham University

Chatham split a pair of ECAC Women's West contests against SUNY Potsdam. Chatham dropped the first contest by an 4-0 score. Chatham's offense got hot in the second contest and came away with a 6-3 win. First-year Dawson Bancroft-Short scored four goals including the game winner and added an assist for a five point game. First-year Leah McNaughton added two goals and an assist and first-year Sara Forbes added four assists on the day.



### Cortland State

The Red Dragons dropped a pair of ECAC West games at Oswego over the weekend both by 1-0 scores. On Saturday, freshman goalie Katie Double made 32 saves. Double then turned aside 23 shots in Sunday's game. The Red Dragons return to action this weekend when they host Plattsburgh in a pair of league contests.



### Elmira College

The Soaring Eagles swept rival Neumann College this past weekend. Elmira was led by Jenna McCall who tallied 3 goals and 2 assists in the two victories. With the wins Elmira now sits atop the ECAC standings. They will return to action this Friday to face Manhattanville College.



### Neumann College

Neumann fell to No. 4 Elmira in a pair of games over the weekend, 5-1 and 2-1. The Knights go on the road for four games, this weekend to Potsdam and next weekend to Buffalo St.



### Oswego State

Oswego State moved into a two-way tie for fifth place in the ECAC Women's West standings with a pair of 1-0 triumphs over SUNY Cortland in a two-game weekend series (Jan. 31 and Feb. 1) in Oswego. Junior Jenna Kirkwood scored the winning goal in the opener with 48 seconds remaining in overtime, while freshman Laurin Gilpin delivered the game winner in game two with 29 seconds left on the clock. Sophomore goaltender Emi Williams made 31 saves in posting back-to-back shutouts, improving to 6-5-0 on the season. The Lakers will travel to Utica College for a Friday/Saturday series on Feb. 6-7. Both are currently tied for fifth place in the standings.



### Plattsburgh State

Stephanie Moberg leads the team in scoring with 14 goals and 21 points. Danielle Blanchard has a team-leading 13 assists and is second in points (19). Lindsay Brown recorded an assist in a 5-0 win Sunday against Buffalo State - her 100th game in a Cardinals uniform; Brown now has 77 career points on 33 goals and 44 assists. Blanchard needs two assists to rank second all-time in school history. Kate Fairfield is having a career year with nine goals and seven assists for 16 points, surpassing her freshman scoring totals of 9-5=14. Plattsburgh has not allowed a goal in the last 185:32, spanning four games. The Cardinals' three losses this season have come by identical 2-1 scores, including two overtime games. Ainsley Brien leads Plattsburgh defenseman in scoring with 10 points, including nine assists. Danielle Beattie leads the ECAC-West with a 1.15 goals-against average.



### SUNY Potsdam

The Bears (4-11-2, 3-9-2 ECAC West) enjoyed a big 4-0 shutout victory over Chatham on Saturday before falling 6-3 to Chatham on Sunday. Goalkeeper Hilary Hitchman had 48 saves on Saturday as she added her second shutout of the year. Forward Kristine Faffley led the Potsdam offense on the week with two goals and one assist.



### Rochester Institute of Tech.

RIT moved to 15-2-2 overall and 11-2-1 in ECAC West play after sweeping Utica, 3-2 and 2-1 this weekend. RIT is 7-2-0 all-time against Utica. Senior defenseman Lindsay Littman played in her 100th collegiate game on Sunday. Katie Stack scored RIT's nation-leading ninth shorthanded goal of the season with 26 seconds left in regulation to lift the Tigers to a 3-2 win over Utica on Saturday. It was her third shorthanded goal, tying her for the national lead. The Tigers are tied with Elmira and Manhattanville for the national lead in scoring, with 91 goals



### Utica College

The Utica College women's hockey team lost two games, both by just one goal, against visiting and nationally-ranked No. 5 RIT Saturday and Sunday. UC lost in the last minute of the contest, 3-2, Saturday, before falling 2-1 on Sunday. Krystal Cummings and Andrea Maxon both scored for UC on Saturday while sophomore goalie Kelley Peers stopped a season-high 46 shots in net for the Pioneers. On Sunday, freshman defender MacKenzie Roy ripped a slap shot from the point for the Pioneers lone goal of the evening in the second period. Junior goalie Jill Doherty stopped 29 shots and dropped to 6-4-1 overall in net this season. The Pioneers will host conference foe Oswego State Friday and Saturday night.
