### PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Stephanie Moberg-Plattsburgh State**  
**Senior, Center, Saratoga Springs, N.Y./Northwood School**  
The team co-captain had a five-point weekend--including a team-best four goals--to surpass 100 for her career, becoming the sixth Cardinal to reach that milestone. She had two goals and an assist in Saturday's 6-0 win against Neumann, and followed up that performance with two goals on Sunday to complete the ECAC West series sweep of the Knights, 7-0. She added 11 shots on goal and a plus-8 rating. She now has 102 points on 41 goals and 61 assists in her 88-game career.



### GOALIE OF THE WEEK

**Mandy Mackrell-Plattsburgh State**  
**Junior, Cleveland, Ohio/Ohio Flames**  
Mackrell posted back-to-back shutouts for the first time in her career, defeating conference rival Neumann by scores of 6-0 and 7-0. She compiled 42 saves while lowering her goals-against average from 1.99 to 1.20, which ranks second in the ECAC West.



### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

**Kim Schlattman-RIT**  
**Forward, Stratford, Ontario/Cambridge Fury**  
Schlattman recorded a goal and two assists in a 2-0-0 week for the Tigers. On Friday, she scored the game-tying goal and added an assist in Friday's 7-3 win over Williams. The following day, she dished out an assist in a 3-1 win at New England. Schlattman has a point in all six games this season, and is tied for second on the team with 10 points (3-7-10). She is third in the nation in points per game among all rookies.



### Honor Roll

**Jill Doherty-Utica College**  
**Senior, Goalie, Wellesley, Mass./Kents Hill**  
Doherty stopped 43 shots and allowed just one goal in a 2-0 weekend for the Pioneers. She stopped 24 shots and guided the Pioneers' to a 3-0 shutout victory over Cortland on Sunday. Doherty now has nine career shut outs and needs two more to tie the school record. She also added 19 saves in the Pioneers' 3-1 win on Saturday. She currently ranks second nationally in total saves with 300.

**Allie Frank-Chatham**  
**Freshman, Goalie, Glendale, Ariz./Tilton High School**  
In this weekend's ECAC match-ups against Elmira College, the first year goalkeeper from Glendale, Ariz. tallied a total of 97 saves in the two losses, 45 in Saturday's contest, and 52 in Sunday's contest. Thus far in the season, Frank has saved 122 shots and given up 15 goals for a .891 save percentage.

**Katie Olejarski-Buffalo State**  
**Junior, Defender, Rockford, Ill./Rockford U19**  
Olejarski scored a pair of power-play goals, including the game-winner in Sunday's 3-2 victory over host Williams. The goals were her first of the season.

**Brittany Meade-Plattsburgh State**  
**Forward, Junior, Saranac Lake, N.Y./ Cornwall Typhoons**  
Recorded the best two-game stretch of her career by leading the team with seven points on two goals (one for a power play) and five assists, to go along with four shots on goal and plus-8 rating. She now is tied for first on the team with eight assists and 11 points in only six games, both already career highs to go along with a personal-best three goals.



## Buffalo State

Buffalo State hit the road for a pair of non-conference games this past weekend. After falling 6-0 to nationally-ranked No. 3 Middlebury, the Bengals bounced back with a 3-2 upset victory over Williams on Sunday. Katie Olejarski netted her first two goals of the season, including the game-winner, and Alyssa Koniar made 40 saves, including stopping all 25 shots she faced in the third period.



## Chatham University

The Cougars traveled to Elmira, New York this weekend to take on Elmira College in an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) match-up. In Saturday's contest, Elmira handed Chatham a 6-0 deficit and another conference loss. In the second match-up on Sunday, junior defender Kelsey LaHue was able to find the back of the net; however, it was not enough for the victory as Elmira defeated Chatham by a final score of 4-1. The Cougars (0-8-1, 0-7-1) won't be in action again until after the New Year when they travel to Burlington, VT to compete in the St. Michael's Classic Tournament against Plymouth State University and Colby College. Game times are set for Friday, January 1st and Saturday, January 2nd at 5:10 pm and 1 pm, respectively.



## Utica College

Utica College went 2-0 in ECAC Women's West Conference play against Cortland this past weekend. Junior forward Darcy Hier totaled four points on the weekend (one goal, three assists), while classmate Jodie Galluzzi added one goal and one assist. Senior goalie Jill Doherty earned second star and first star honors, respectively, after allowing just one goal in two contests. The Pioneers, who have not lost a game since Jan. 15th, are 6-4-1 overall and 4-2-1 on conference play. UC returns to action on Saturday when they travel to Williams College to take on the Ephs at 2 p.m.



## Elmira College

Elmira College picked up two wins in ECAC West action this weekend. They took two games from visiting Chatham University including a 6-0 shutout and a 4-1 victory. Lauryn DePaul shined for Elmira as she earned 6 points in the two games including 2 goals and 4 assists. Rookie goaltenders Lauren Sullivan and Samantha Maguire each earned wins.



## Cortland State

The Red Dragons dropped a pair of conference games to Utica over the weekend, 3-1 on Saturday and 3-0 on Sunday. On Saturday, freshman goalie Sarah Sitcov made 26 saves and freshman Chelsey Wright scored her team-high fourth goal of the season. On Sunday, Sitcov registered a career-best 36 saves. Cortland is now off until Friday, January 8, when it hosts Hamilton in a non-conference game.



## Oswego State

Oswego State suffered a weekend sweep at the hands of Division I Sacred Heart as the Pioneers recorded 6-1 and 7-2 wins over the weekend in Bridgeport, Conn. to fall to 4-5-0 overall. In Friday's contest, senior assistant captain Jenna Kirkwood (Chilliwack, B.C.) registered her seventh goal of the season, which is the second-highest single season total for a Laker since the program's inception in 2006-07. Jessica Lister set the single-season record of 15 goals during Oswego State's inaugural season. Tiarra Garrow (Sr., Morrisonville, N.Y.) and Kelly Collins (So., Fairport, N.Y.) tallied both Laker goals in Saturday's loss. Oswego State returns to action on Jan. 9 when it competes at the Castleton Tournament.



## Plattsburgh State

Plattsburgh heads into the New Year with a 7-0 overall and ECAC West record, the first time in school history that the team is undefeated and untied going into the Christmas Break. Stephanie Moberg is tied with Brittany Meade for the team lead with 11 points and has a team-leading seven goals. Junior Kara Buehler had four assists against Neumann on Saturday, which was one shy of a school record and believed to be the most ever by a Cardinal defenseman in a single game. Buehler leads ECAC West blueliners with eight assists and is tied for the most points. Goalie Mandy Mackrell tops the league with a .943 save percentage and 1,000 winning percentage (5-0). Plattsburgh is the least-penalized team in the nation (8.0 PIM/game). The Plattsburgh offense (5.29 goals per game) is second in the ECAC West and the defense (1.43) is first. 14 different players have accounted for the team's 37 goals, and all but two skaters have at least one point.



## SUNY Potsdam

Potsdam takes the ice again on December 9, when they host Hamilton for a 7:00 p.m. start.



## Rochester Institute of Tech.

Seventh ranked RIT improved to 5-0-1 to start the season, defeating Williams 7-3 on Saturday, and New England, 3-1 on Sunday. RIT scored five third period goals to erase a 3-2 deficit on Saturday. Sarah Dagg has 16 points (4-12-16) in six games this season. She leads the nation with 12 assists, is second nationally in points per game, and has at least two points in all six games this season. Junior forward Katie Stack (Batavia) leads the team with seven goals, three power-play tallies, and two game-winners. Freshman forward Kim Schlattman is third in the nation in points per game among all rookies. Freshman goaltender Carley King came on in relief on Saturday and shut Williams out for the final 27 minutes. The next day, she was 1:41 away from her first collegiate shutout in a 3-1 win. She is seventh nationally in goals against average. The Tigers have scored one power-play goal in each of the six games this season. Tigers are 16-for-44 (.364) on the power-play this season, which leads the nation. RIT is also the highest scoring team in the nation (6.83 goals per game). This weekend the Tigers travel to defending national champion and current No. 1 Amherst (5-0-0) for a pair of games this weekend. Friday's game is at 7 p.m. and Saturday's is at 3 p.m. Amherst has the nation's stingiest defense, allowing just three goals in five games this year. They have outscored foes 22-3 this season. Last year, RIT defeated Amherst, 4-1 at Ritter Arena.



## Neumann University

Neumann dropped two games to #2 Plattsburgh State over the weekend in ECAC West action. Shannon Donnelly made 46 saves in net Saturday night. Laura Keeley had 33 saves on Sunday afternoon. The Knights will travel to Trinity and Wesleyan (Conn.) this weekend for non-conference action.
