## ECAC Announces 2007 Division III Field Hockey All-Stars

CAPE COD, Mass. - Junior forward Lindsey McNamara of Bowdoin College has been chosen as the 2007 ECAC Division III Field Hockey Player of the Year. McNamara ranked third in the nation with 27 goals and 3.05 points per game. Recognized as the NESCAC Player of the Year, she led Bowdoin to a perfect 20-0 record and the national title. This is the second year in a row that McNamara was selected to the All-ECAC first team.

Bowdoin College sweeps the major awards as forward Ingrid Oelschlager has been voted the Rookie of the Year. Oelschlager earned a place on the All-ECAC second team, following a campaign where she scored 16 goals.

The four All-ECAC first team forwards all rank in the top five in the nation in goals scored. Along with McNamara on the front line are Danielle Miranda of Rowan, Amanda Lester of New England College, and Kim Wagner of Juniata. Lester was tied for the nation's lead in goals scored with 36, and topped the nation in points per game (4.00). Miranda (25 goals) and Wagner (24 goals) each received Offensive Player of the Year honors from their respective conferences. This is Wagner's second nod onto the All-ECAC first team.

At the midfield position the All-ECAC first team consists of Kait Sutherland from Ursinus, Katie Reuther from TCNJ, and Erin Dallas of Keene State. Sutherland, the Centennial Conference Player of the Year, led Ursinus to an 18-3 record behind her 15 goals and 12 assists. Reuther was part of a 17-3 TCNJ team that advanced to the NCAA third round. Dallas tallied 45 points on the season as Keene State qualified for the NCAA tournament.

Val Young of Bowdoin earns All-ECAC first team defender honors for the second consecutive year. Salisbury's Danielle Twilley also finds a spot on the first team as a defender. From her position in the back, she scored 15 goals and assisted on five others en route to being named the Capital Athletic Player of the Year. Kelly Mitchell of TCNJ rounds out the defensive unit on the All-ECAC first team. Mitchell was the Defensive Player of the Year in the NJAC.

Senior goalkeeper Maria Ramoundos of Salisbury is the final player to make the All-ECAC first team. With the third-best goal against average in the country at 0.67, Ramoundos helped Salisbury attain a 20-2 record and reach the NCAA semifinals.
