

## **Field Hockey Players of the Week (for the week ending October 18, 2009)**

### **Division I**

#### *Co-Offensive Player of the Week*

**Amy Kee – Syracuse University  
Freshman, Back, Hertfordshire, England**

Kee tallied the game-winning goal in the second overtime to lead No. 6 Syracuse over No. 7 Connecticut on Oct. 17. The freshman back also was credited with an assist on SU's first goal of the game. Kee's goal in the 88th minute came off her game-high sixth shot.

**Anne Schreuders – St. Joseph's University  
Senior, Midfielder, Utrecht, Netherlands**

Schreuders tallied her first career hat trick on Friday as Saint Joseph's upended No. 10 Massachusetts, 3-0. She scored on a penalty corner 1:53 into the contest to put SJU ahead, then one-timed a shot past the keeper at 8:38 to double the lead before sending home a long range blast with ten minutes left in regulation. She leads the team with 11 goals and 26 points.

#### *Defensive Player of the Week*

**Lena Voelmle – Syracuse University  
Freshman, Back, Hershey, Pa.**

Voelmle was responsible for shutting down the nation's top scorer when the Orange defeated No. 7 Connecticut, 3-2, in double overtime. The freshman back held UConn's Loren Sherer without a goal through 88 minutes of play.

### **Division III New England**

#### *Offensive Player of the Week*

**Christy Bradley – Trinity College  
Junior, Forward, Wellesley, Mass.**

Bradley had both of the Bantams goals during a 2-1 overtime win at Tufts in a battle between undefeated teams on Saturday afternoon. Bradley's first goal tied the contest at one-all in the 44th minute before her second tally gave Trinity the win eight minutes into overtime.

#### *Defensive Player of the Week*

**Tricia Chase – Mount Holyoke College  
Sophomore, Back, Feeding Hills, Mass.**

Chase lifted the Mount Holyoke field hockey team to a perfect 3-0 week with her outstanding play at both ends of the field. The defender totaled one goal, one assist and one defensive save. She anchored a Lyons defense that surrendered just one goal. Chase made a key defensive save at the end of regulation in Mount Holyoke's 2-1 overtime triumph over Springfield College on Tuesday. The defender then assisted the match winner in the Lyons 2-0 victory over Babson College on Friday and added a goal of her own in a 3-0 win over Hendrix College on Sunday.

**Danielle Hand – SUNY Cortland  
Sophomore, Forward, Whitney Point, N.Y.**

Hand led the sixth-ranked Red Dragons to a pair of SUNYAC wins over the weekend. On Friday in a 5-3 win versus New Paltz, Hand collected a goal and an assist. On Saturday, Hand scored back-to-back goals as the Red Dragons defeated Oneonta, 4-2, to raise their record to 14-0 overall and 6-0 in the SUNYAC. Hand leads Cortland with ten goals and is second in scoring with 21 points.

Yoder scored five goals and handed out two assists in a 2-0 week for the Bears. She had a hat trick with an assist in the victory against McDaniel.
